Did you know...

One parish ministry has been very busy! The Saint Alphonsus/Ave Maria Food Pantry & Friends of the Poor Committee have been serving needy clients throughout Tipton and Lauderdale Counties for many years due to generous donations from our parishioners. Additionally since May 2020 we have enjoyed a wonderful partnership with Catholic Charities of West Tennessee (CCWT). CCWT has provided our Food Pantry with:

- 1. over 500 prepared boxes of dried food,
- 2. thousands of pounds of frozen meats and,
- 3. over 500 dozen eggs.

During the month of August we were able to help 145 families (a total of 341 people) with basic food needs. Over half of these families have children and many of the remainder are quite elderly.

Our Friends of the Poor activity help families who are having trouble with sufficient funds to keep their utilities on or even paying their rent. We typically have limits on the amount given to an applicant and on rare occasions we will provide greater assistance based on our funds available. During the month of August, Friends of the Poor were able to help 8 families financially with rent or utilities. Furthermore, we assist the homeless with temporary shelter and other basic needs.

Continued support is still much needed and greatly appreciated from our parishioners to allow this ministry to assist those in our communities who are in need.

Our team recently welcomed two new members in Ellis Barrett and David Calvet. We can always use an extra set of hands if you're looking for something to do on Tuesday mornings from 9AM to 11AM. Please contact Dave Hessling at 901-497-2720 to volunteer. If you know of a family that is in need and could use some assistance ensuring they have food, please let them know about our Food Pantry. No one is turned away!!
