John "Jack" Smith of Atoka passed away on Monday, July 29, 2019.

Jack was born in Detroit MI January 25, 1941. He joined the U. S. Navy in 1958 and retired at NAS Millington as a Senior Chief Petty Officer in 1977. He joined a Defense Contractor in Memphis as a Technical Writer soon after retiring, then was transferred to Orlando Fl. in 1981, where he retired in 2006 as the Vice President of Undersea Programs. While in Florida, he started a children's charity, Cruisers for Kids, which donates 100% to Make a Wish Foundation. After that he and his wife Joan returned to Tipton County. Jack served as the Atoka TN Santa Claus for several years and was Santa at the Pink Palace in Memphis for five years until poor health necessitated his final retirement.

There will be a Rosary Service at St. Alphonsus Catholic Church in Covington on Friday, August 9 at 7 p.m. with a funeral Mass the following afternoon, Saturday, August 10 at 1 p.m., also at the church.

Holy Day of Obligation: August 15

THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY



Please remember Thursday, August 15th is a holy day of obligation. There will be a Mass at St. Alphonsus at 6:00 pm, along with a brief special presentation with special speakers. Please be sure to attend. There will be a small reception afterwards in the Parish Hall.

The reading from *Revelation* assigned for the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary is about Mary and the Church.

The Solemnity of the Assumption—and our reading—teach us that Mary represents the whole people of God, that she is an image—a model of the Church. What she did is what the Church does, and vice versa. The Church offers Christ to the world. So did Mary. The Church only makes sense in light of Christ. So does Mary. We cannot properly venerate the Blessed Mother without including Christ and the Church, nor rightly conceive of the Church without Mary.

Today we offer God thanks: thanks for our Blessed Mother, thanks for the Church, and thanks for our heavenly future that she represents.



A Mass to mark the 129th anniversary of the death of Venerable Father Michael J. McGivney, founder of the Knights of Columbus and a candidate for sainthood, will be held on Sunday, August 15th, at 10:30am. A native of Waterbury, Conn., Father McGivney was serving as parish priest at St. Mary's Catholic Church in New Haven, CT when he gathered a handful of men in the church basement to found the Knights of Columbus in 1882. The Knights of Columbus has since gone on to become the world's largest Catholic fraternal organization with nearly 1.9 million members in North and Latin America, the Caribbean, Asia and Europe. Continuing Father McGivney's mission, the Knights has become one of the most active charitable organizations in the United States, donating more than \$185.6 million and 75.6 million hours of service worldwide in 2017 and growing today.
