Saint Bede the Venerable's Story-May 25

Bede is one of the few saints honored as such even during his lifetime. His writings were filled with such faith and learning that even while he was still alive, a Church council ordered them to be read publicly in the churches.

At an early age, Bede was entrusted to the care of the abbot of the Monastery of St. Paul, Jarrow. The happy combination of genius and the instruction of scholarly, saintly monks, produced a saint and an extraordinary

scholar, perhaps the most outstanding one of his day. He was deeply versed in all the sciences of his times: natural philosophy, the philosophical principles of Aristotle, astronomy, arithmetic, grammar, ecclesiastical history, the lives of the saints and especially, holy Scripture.

From the time of his ordination to the priesthood at 30—he had been ordained a deacon at 19—till his death, Bede was ever occupied with learning, writing, and teaching. Besides the many books that he copied, he composed 45 of his own, including 30 commentaries on books of the Bible.

His *Ecclesiastical History of the English People* is commonly regarded as of decisive importance in the art and science of writing history. A unique era was coming to an end at the time of Bede's death: It had fulfilled its purpose of preparing Western Christianity to assimilate the non-Roman barbarian North. Bede recognized the opening to a new day in the life of the Church even as it was happening.

Although eagerly sought by kings and other notables, even Pope Sergius, Bede managed to remain in his own monastery until his death. Only once did he leave for a few months in order to teach in the school of the archbishop of York. Bede died in 735 praying his favorite prayer: "Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. As in the beginning, so now, and forever."

Reflection:

Though his *History* is the greatest legacy Bede has left us, his work in all the sciences, especially in Scripture, should not be overlooked. During his last Lent, Bede worked on a translation of the *Gospel of Saint John* into English, completing it the day he died. But of this work "to break the word to the poor and unlearned" nothing remains today.

DECREE

After reading the publications of the most recent communication from the C.D.C. and from the Health Departments that serve the twenty-one counties that make up the Catholic Diocese of Memphis, I offer this new DECREE. This new DECREE becomes effective at the end of the school year for our Catholic schools. As you will see, most of the restrictions regarding public worship, seen at the beginning of this terrible pandemic (March of 2020), are no longer mentioned, no longer applicable. The GOLDEN RULE of the Risen Lord Jesus continues to be our guide in this and in every issue that we face as a Diocese (Leviticus 19. 18, 34; Matthew 7.12; Luke 6.31). I will remain attentive to news about this pandemic.

<u>FIRST:</u> While guarding our health and the health of our neighbor during this pandemic, we need to come back to the Sunday celebration of holy Mass. We need to come back and renew the strength of each parish community of faith. We need to hold sacred "the LORD's DAY".

As has been mentioned before, please note that "If participation in the Eucharistic celebration becomes impossible because of the absence of a sacred minister or <u>another grave cause</u>, it is strongly recommended that the faithful...devote themselves to prayer for suitable time alone, as a family... (canon 1248)".

What is a grave cause that would make it impossible to meet the "Sunday obligation"? Granting the continued presence of this infectious new coronavirus among our people, any health precondition that makes the person or parent or health provider more vulnerable to COVID 19...this kind of issue is the kind of grave cause mentioned in the canon above.

I continue to ask all Catholics and their families and friends to join your Pastor in the fellowship of our Catholic parishes, for Sunday Mass and for the ongoing formation of our lives, lived in Christ the Lord.

SECOND: Please follow the required instructions and restrictions listed below:

- 1. The withholding of the *cup of blessing* (chalices for Holy Communion) during holy Mass continues in effect *until further notice*.
- 2. Each Pastor is to determine how best to monitor "safe physical distancing". Families living in the same household and those fully vaccinated should be encouraged to sit together.
- 3. Facial coverings (masks) are recommended but optional. Each Pastor should remain attentive to the health concerns of his parishioners.
- 4. All clergy and all that assist them in administering Holy Communion are encouraged to "purify hands" thoroughly before and after offering Holy Communion.

This Decree is given on the 14th of May 2021 and takes effect on the 28th of May 2021. I am yours, in the light and love of the Risen Lord,

DECRETO

Habiendo leído las publicaciones del comunicado más reciente de de la C.D.C. y de los Departamentos de Salud que sirven a los veintiún condados que conforman la Diócesis Católica de Memphis, ofrezco este nuevo DECRETO. Este nuevo DECRETO entrara en efecto al final del ciclo escolar de nuestras escuelas Católicas. Como verán, la mayoría de las restricciones relacionadas con el culto público, provistas al inicio de esta terrible pandemia (Marzo de 2020), ya no se mencionan, ya no aplican. La REGLA de ORO de Nuestro Señor Resucitado sigue siendo nuestra guía en esta y todas las cuestiones que enfrentamos como Diócesis (Levítico 19. 18, 34; Mateo 7. 12; Lucas 6. 31). Yo permaneceré atento a las noticias respecto de esta pandemia.

<u>PRIMERO:</u> Al tiempo que resguardamos nuestra salud y la de nuestro prójimo durante esta pandemia, necesitamos regresar a la Celebración Dominical de la Santa Misa. Necesitamos regresar y renovar la Fortaleza de cada una de nuestras comunidades parroquiales de Fe. Necesitamos santificar el "DIA del SEÑOR".

Como ha sido mencionado antes, por favor noten que, si "la participación en la Celebración Eucarística se hiciera imposible por la ausencia de un ministro sagrado u <u>otra causa grave</u>, es fuertemente recomendable que los fieles ... se vuelquen devotos en sí mismos a la oración por un tiempo apropiado, ya en soledad o en familia ... (canon 1248)".

¿Que constituye una <u>causa grave</u> que haría imposible cumplir esta "Obligación Dominical"? Dada la continua presencia de este nuevo Coronavirus, que es altamente infeccioso, entre nuestra gente, cualquier condición de salud pre-existente que hace a la persona, a sus padres, o al personal de salud que le cuida o atiende, más vulnerables al COVID 19 es el tipo de causa grave mencionada en el canon citado arriba.

Sigo pidiendo a todos los Católicos y a sus familiares y amigos que se unan a sus párrocos en la comunión de nuestras parroquias católicas, tanto para la Misa Dominical como para nuestra continua formación para nuestras vidas, vividas en Cristo, el Señor.

SEGUNDO, Por favor sigan las instrucciones y restricciones requeridas y listadas a continuación:

- 1. Se mantiene en efecto el desuso del Cáliz de Bendición (la copa, durante la Sagrada Comunión durante la Santa Misa *hasta nuevo aviso*.
- 2. Cada Párroco se encargara de determinar la mejor manera de monitorear "un distanciamiento físico seguro". A las familias que vivan bajo el mismo techo y quienes ya estén completamente vacunados se les exhortara a sentarse juntos.
- 3. Las mascarillas son recomendables, pero opcionales. Cada Párroco permanecerá atento a las preocupaciones de salud de los feligreses de su parroquia.
- 4. A todos los párrocos y quienes les ayuden en la distribución de la Sagrada Comunión se les sigue exhortando a purificar sus manos a conciencia y totalmente antes y después de la distribución de la Sagrada Comunión

Este decreto es dado el día 14vo día del mes de Mayo, y entrara en efecto en día 28 de Mayo de 2021.
